1. Competition is open to all residents of **all counties**.
2. Open Class Farm Products will be judged Sunday preceding the fair at 4:00 P.M.
3. Entry blanks in back of fair book may be used. Additional entry blanks are available at the fair office.
4. **Entries close Monday, July 19th at 4:00 P.M. This is an absolute deadline!**
5. **No entries accepted other than those listed.**
6. Entry fee has been waived by the Fair Association. However, an entry form must be submitted so entry tags/stubs can be issued and prizes awarded.
7. **All articles must be delivered on Saturday, 10:00 A.M. - 2:00 P.M. or Sunday, 12 Noon - 3:30 P.M. preceding the fair.**
8. All articles must be called for on **Monday, following the fair** from 10:00 A.M. - 2:00 P.M. The Association will not be responsible for articles left after 2:00 P.M. on that day. All exhibits must remain on display the last day of the fair. **NO EXCEPTIONS!** Entry stubs must be presented for removal of articles.
9. Exhibits must be grown by the exhibitor and as far as possible be the product of the present year.
10. Not more than one entry allowed in any one class to the same exhibitor and products of the same farm or gardens cannot be shown in the same class by different exhibitors.
11. Exhibits of Grains shall consist of not less than one quart: Each bundle of Grain or Grass shall be tightly bound by two bands and must measure at least four inches in diameter at the lower band. \*Corn roots should be in a plastic bag.
12. Entries may be made by mail. If entry is received and postage is enclosed, tags will be mailed. Otherwise, tags will be held at the office until called for.
13. All items must be checked in with Superintendent. Please return all unused entry tags/stubs (items not entered) to the Superintendent the day exhibits are brought in. This will help move the judging along faster.
14. Special award money will be issued on Monday following the fair, with premium checks to follow in the mail.
