



**All Cattle and Deliveries MUST come through the new delivery gate on 10th Street.**

1. Competition is open to all residents and non-residents of Cattaraugus County.
2. Open Class Holsteins and Guernseys will be judged on Tuesday, at 8:30 A.M. and all other dairy breeds on Saturday, at 8:30 A.M. Guernsey show will be held first on Tuesday starting at 8:30 A.M.
3. Entry blanks in back of fair book may be used. Additional entry blanks are available at the fair office or may be copied.
4. **Entries close Monday, July 18th at 4:00 P.M.** Late entries will be accepted only by the Dairy Superintendent, approval based on space available. Exception is rule # 18.
5. The entry fee is \$3.00 for each single and group entry. All animals shown in the groups must be entered in the individual classes. All production awards in classes marked "\*\*\*\*" (12, 14, 16, 18, 20, 22, 24, 26, 28, 30 & 32) must be pre-entered at a cost of \$1.00 for each class entered. **All entry fees must be paid in full at time of entry deadline.** Late entries will be charged an additional \$5.00 fee per class entered. Late entries will not be accepted within 48 hours of the open show.
6. The owners of all cattle shall be required to show a registration paper to identify each animal. All owners must be listed on entry form.
7. An exhibitor is not limited to entries in any 1 class. An exhibitor is, however, limited to two (2) cash prizes in individual classes and one (1) cash prize in group classes.
8. Non-members are required to purchase an exhibitor's pass for \$15.00. A 2nd pass may be purchased if needed. Individual names must be on these passes. All vehicles must have an exhibitor sticker to enter exhibitor gate on 10th Street.
9. Holsteins and Guernseys must be in place on Sunday by noon and released Wednesday at 3:00 P.M. Other breeds must be in place on Thursday by noon and released Sunday at 6:00 P.M.
10. Identified, qualified and registered Holsteins may be entered in calf & heifer classes. Qualified and registered Holsteins may be entered in cow classes.
11. Age of animals as follows: No animal can be advanced ahead. They must be shown at exact age.
  - Junior Calf - Born after March 1 of current year
  - Intermediate Calf - Born between December 1 of last year and February 29 of current year
  - Senior Calf - Born between September 1 & November 30 of last year
  - Summer Yearling - Born between June 1 & August 31 of last year
  - Junior Yearling - Born between March 1 & May 31 of last year
  - Intermediate Yearling - Born between December 1, 2 years ago & February 29 last year
  - Senior Yearling - Born between September 1 & November 30, 2 years ago
  - Junior 2 year old - Born between March 1 & August 31, 2 years ago
  - Senior 2 year old - Born between September 1, 3 years ago & February 29, 2 years ago
  - Junior 3 year old - Born between March 1 & August 31, 3 years ago (Holstein exhibitors only)
  - Senior 3 year old - Born between September 1 & February 31, 3 years ago (Holstein exhibitors only)
  - Cow 3 years old - Born between September 1, 4 years ago & August 31, 3 years ago
  - Cow 4 years old - Born between September 1, 5 years ago & August 31, 4 years ago
  - Cow 5 years old - Born between September 1, 6 years ago & August 31, 5 years ago
  - Aged Cow - Born before September 1, 6 years & older

12. Dry Cow class - Cows shown in this class may not show in milking class.
13. The Best Three Females shall consist of 3 females bred and owned by the exhibitor. Exhibitor must have owned the dam when bred that produced these exhibitor bred animals.
14. The Produce of Dam shall consist of two (2) animals, from the same cow.
15. The Exhibitors Herd shall consist of 5 animals; 2 over 2 years, 2 under 2 years, and one of your choice. (All to be owned by exhibitor, & at least 3 bred by exhibitor.)
16. The Premier Exhibitor Award will be given to the exhibitor having the highest total winnings for any eight (8) individual animals in the individual classes.
17. The Superintendent and Clerk will check registration papers (in the ring) in all group classes.
18. Any animal placing 1st or 2nd in the Jr. Show, shown by owner, will be eligible to compete in the open class show. Entry fee must be paid. Entry must be made at the Main Office by 5:00 P.M. day preceding the open class judging. Holsteins and Guernseys must be pre - entered.
19. Best Production Record will be checked before day of show. Only the latest completed 305 day or less record appearing on the supervised test sheets will be used in determining winners.
20. Where a herd is registered in the names of different members of a family, residing on one farm where the herd is a unit, all entries may be considered as a single exhibit.
21. Dairy Herd shall consist of three milking or dry cows all owned by the exhibitor.
22. 100,000 lb. cow cannot be shown in previous classes.
23. **There will be only one (1) milk check written per farm. Family units will be considered as one (1).**
24. All substitutions within a class only must be made no later than 48 hours prior to the open show at the Corporate Building.
25. Milking parlor will be open on Sunday evening.
26. All cows must be milked in the milking parlor. The milking parlor operator will accommodate exhibitors with a milking schedule.
27. A Rosette will be awarded for the Best Udder in each of the milking classes.
28. Friendship Dairies will award a Grand Champion, Reserve Grand Champion, Junior Champion and Reserve Junior Champion trophy for each breed show.
29. An award of \$25 will be given for the cow with the highest milk production for each breed. The periods recorded will be for Monday morning through Wednesday morning and for Friday morning through Sunday morning. Sponsored by Fair Association.
30. No canvas, tarps, advertisement signs or other obstructions may be erected without the approval of the dairy superintendent.
31. **Any exhibitor who fails to comply with the rules and regulations, reasonable requests, or causes a confrontation with other exhibitors or supervisors will be asked to leave the grounds. All premiums, awards and other payments will be forfeited by the exhibitor.**
32. No parking will be permitted under the barns.
33. **Children under 16 must have a guardian accompany them at all times.**
34. Housing space for cattle and necessary supplies will take priority over other non-dairy equipment.
35. **“No initial bedding will be provided. Exhibitors should bring their own bedding.**

- ★ **No sleeping overnight in the barns by any exhibitor, 19 years of age and under.**
- ★ **All adults intending to stay in the barns must verify with the superintendent of that area.**

- ★ **Due to health regulations concerning E-Coli and other contaminations, cooking and eating in the livestock areas is not recommended.**
