25. Produce of Dam: Two head, any age, any sex, shown in individual classes produced by one dam and owned by exhibitor. Exhibitor limited to one entry.
26. Breeder's Special: Two head, any age, any sex, shown in individual classes, bred and owned by exhibitor. Exhibitor limited to one entry.

Section 27 – Class No. 1 - Jackpot Steer

- Steers must be under 24 months of age.
- All steers must weigh over 950 lbs. Each will be weighed at time of unloading at Fair.
- Jackpot steers must be in place on Wednesday of Fair by 9 p.m.
- Age certificate to accompany steer at weigh-in, plus applicable health papers.
- No limit to entries.
- Entry fee - \$25.00
- Prizes: Grand Champion Jackpot Steer – 75% of entry fees.
 - o Reserve Grand Champion Jackpot Steer – 25% of entry fees.
 - o Placings 1-5 will reserve ribbons.
- 4-H and FFA will be allowed to show if they follow Jackpot Steer rules, including entry date.
- Jackpot Steers will be shown at the end of breeding beef show.

DEPARTMENT G - GOAT

2. Goats will be judged concurrently with 4-H goats on Monday at 10:30 a.m.
3. Goats must be in place by Sunday, preceding Fair, at 2:00 p.m. All show animals must remain on the grounds all week. Goats will be released at 6:00 p.m. on Sunday, last day of Fair.
4. Exhibitors are limited to 2 entries per age class per breed. Only 1 entry per specialty class (18-24).
5. ADGA rules will govern.
6. All animals must be identified by a legible registration tattoo or a USDA approved official identification tag. There will be no pre-show milk-out. Overdistended udders are subject to discrimination. The judge's decision is final. All goats are entered at the sole risk of the owners. Base date for computing the age of goats for classes is the date of the show.
7. Registration papers will be presented to the show Secretary before the show begins. Proof of ownership shall be the name on the registration or recordation certificate or stamped duplicate application.
8. All Grand and Reserve Champion animals must compete for Best Doe in Show.
9. All animals show in group or special classes must have been show in their regular class.
10. An official health certificate will be required for all entries. All entries must be health-checked prior to the show. Any animals showing signs of contagious disease or condition will be dismissed and prohibited from the show. Rules and standards of the NYS Dept of Ag & Markets for the conduct of Fairs and Live-stock Health Requirements shall apply.
11. Specialty classes are judged by breed.
