- All entries must be picked up on Sunday, following the Fair, from 10 AM to 1 PM.
 Entry stubs must be presented at pick up. The Fair is NOT responsible for any articles left after 1 PM.
- Entries must be checked in with the Superintendent. Return any unused tags to the Superintendent. This will help when judging.
- Special award money will be issued on Sunday following the Fair, with premium checks.

- Exhibits must be grown by exhibitor and, as far as possible, be the product of the present year.
- Not more than one entry allowed in any one class by the same exhibitor. Products of the same farm/garden cannot be shown in the same class by different exhibitors.
- Exhibits of grains shall consist of at least one quart. Each bundle of grain or grass shall be tightly bound by two bands and must measure at least four inches in diameter at the lower band. Corn roots should be in a plastic bag.
